ATDS DEFINITION

47 U.S.C §227(a)(1): "The term 'automatic telephone dialing system' means equipment which has the capacity - (A) to store or produce telephone numbers to be called, using a random or sequential number generator; and (B) to dial such numbers."

KEY

"In looking at the device's autodialer functions (or lack thereof), are we only to look at the device's present capacity, or are we to look at the device's potential capacity as well?"

U - Use Issue:

"In determining whether a device is an autodialer, do we only look to see if the device's autodialer capacity was actually being used to make the calls at issue, or do we simply consider if the device has an autodial capacity (regardless of whether that capacity was used to make the calls at issue)?"

G - Number Generation Issue:

"In determining whether a device is an autodialer, do we only include in the ATDS definition devices that actually generate random or sequential numbers, or do we include devices with a broader range of functionalities?"
